He has been a regular attendee of our meetings, so if you have come to any of our annual meetings in the last 35 years you have surely met him and he will have left on you his unforgettable footprint.

Qualifiers such as smart, gentle, intelligent, charming, excellent colleague and friend, endearing, were repeatedly heard in his funeral and I also would like to thank all the many members of the ICCP who attended the wake ceremony for contributing to create the warm atmosphere he was surrounded by. PRESIDENTS COLUMN

We are living in a changing world in which established paths change overnight and we need to adapt to the new circumstances. In the last years we have been facing ways to re-address and re-invent organic petrology applications because the most traditional ones related to coal petrology, source rocks petrology and coke petrology were expected to come soon to an end, due to the need of replacing fossil fuels by renewables sources of energy to confront the climate emergency. In a very short period of time the invasion of Ukraine has caused an energy crisis in Europe which is just one of the many derivatives and suffering that causes a war. Under these circumstances, the eyes are turned again to coal as a robust energy source. Now everything is ready for our forthcoming meeting in India, we are learning to live together with Covid-19 and travelling is returning to pre-pandemic figures. In September we will have our annual meeting in New Delhi. It is the second time that we meet in India and if you have a look at the program it will be an exciting one. One of the greatest assets of our community is the extraordinary relationships which are established among colleagues and this is only possible through personal interaction. I know that travelling overseas is still not easy in every institution, but if there is a chance for you, no doubt that the contact face to face is part of what makes the meetings unforgettable.

Obituary

DR WALTER PICKEL

Walter M. Pickel was born in Aachen, Germany, in 1957, a town to which he has been always strongly linked. After graduating in geology, he undertook PhD studies at the Rheinisch Westfälische Hochschule (RWTH) Aachen, an institution highly prestigious in technological studies and whose high reputation in research and teaching of coal science is linked to the names of Erich Stach, Marlies Teichmüller and Monika Wolf. Following his doctorate in 1991, Walter continued to be associated with the RWTH until 1998. During this time, he also participated as lecturer in Cologne University and in both places supervised and co-supervised nine masters and several student thesis projects.

It is probably in the courses and training actions where some aspects of his brilliant personality shone brightest. Walter Pickel has provided graduate courses and workshops in coal geology and petrology in Indonesia, Australia, India and Chile. At the latter, he also was appointed Visiting Professor at the Instituto de Geología Económica Aplicada of the University of Concepción. He has been trainer in the ICCP courses held in Potsdam, and Brisbane together with Claus F.K. Diessel, Angeles G. Borrego, Stavros Kalaitzidis, and Isabel Suárez-Ruiz, and had scheduled one in Patras for October 2022 with Stavros Kalaitzidis. His students will no doubt remember his maybe chaotic but very lively presentations and discussions and the many stories about coal petrology and its practitioners.

Walter Pickel moved to Australia in 1998 to take up employment as a Senior Research Scientist at CSIRO Petroleum in Sydney. In 2003, he joined Harold Read & Associates, and in 2004, he became co-founder and an Executive Director of Coal & Organic Petrology Services P/L, a company that provides analytical services to the Australian coal industry.

Walter Pickel has been a member of numerous national and


international scientific bodies (including the Australian Institute of Mining and Metallurgy, the Latin American Organization of Organic Geochemistry and The Society for Organic Petrology), serving as Chair of the Australian Coal Petrology Group since 2007 and of the National Committee for Coal and Mining Geology of Standards Australia since 2014. He had a proactive role in the establishment and adoption of the International and Australian coal petrology standards.

Walter joined the ICCP as an Associate Member in 1990, becoming a Full Member in 1993. He was Secretary of Commission I from 1994 to 2000 when he became Chairman, serving in that capacity until 2008 and as General Secretary from 2016 to 2019. Since 1991 he has been a dynamic Convener of the Standardization Working Group and a member of the editorial group for the revision of maceral nomenclature. Some of his most renowned publications are related to this activity. Walter Pickel belongs to the distinguished group of ICCP Thiessen Medallists since 2015. He has been a regular attendee of our meetings, where you may have had the opportunity to enjoy his smart, gentle, intelligent, charming and endearing personality. Walter passed unexpectedly away the 3rd of June, his monumental presence and force in ICCP meetings and affairs will be always remembered.






