

# PRESIDENT'S COLUMN

In the Northern Hemisphere we are living through the hottest summer ever registered and fires are burning the Mediterrane-an countries from west to east; these temperatures will very likely be surpassed in the forthcoming years. Organic petrology has provided tools to study the burning records through the geological times and can also provide tools to find out more about the actual fires occurring everywhere in the world.

I would like to welcome the new members and encourage them to participate in the many on-going exercises which have been proposed in the working groups. The mixture of experienced and novel people in the WGs is indeed very valuable and provides a great opportunity to learn a lot. With the imminent results of the CBAP a new Accreditation Round has been completed thanks to the effort of the many people involved in the Accreditation Subcommittee and very specially to the organizers and the Chair.

We have two positions in Council to cover: Chair of Commission I (promoting to President) and Secretary of Commission III (promoting to Chair at the end of the Meeting). It is important that if you think of suitable candidates to fill these positions to contact the General Secretary (Paul Hackley) to let us know. Candidates for the to-be-vacant positions will be announced at the end of the meeting.

Last year the ICCP courses resumed in a new venue, Patras, which proved to be a successful location. A very well attended course was celebrated and therefore the venue has been established as the new regular venue for the training activities. This year the course will take place right after the meeting, so I encourage all, especially students, but not only, to stay for the course. Carolina Fonseca (LAFO, Brazil) will be teaching the transmitted light section instead of João Graciano Mendonça Filho, a last-minute change in the planned program. I would

like to thank both for their efforts to keep the course on-going.

This is the last column I will be writing as President of the ICCP after 8 years in duty. It has been a challenging period with a new actor, the global pandemic, which affected our planned meetings and the ability to travel to the venues for some years. This forced us to put in practice new methods as the hybridformat, which allowed to stay in contact in the distance. Three General Secretaries have accompanied me in these two terms: Walter Pickel, Maria Hamor-Vidó, and Paul Hackley, all of them supporting the tasks of the President countless times. We have also lost also many friends in these 8 years, among them Javier Prado (my Thesis Supervisor), Walter Pickel (General Secretary in my presidency turn) and early this year Harold Smith, the last founder member of the ICCP (see obituary on page 13 herein). WGs have made significant achievements and published the results to make them available for a wider readership. We have also re-stablished our relationship with ISO. A comprehensive report of the milestones during this period will be provided in the next ICCP News issue. I feel really honoured of having served on Council for 27 years and to hold the Presidency of the ICCP in the last 8 years. The challenges are enormous with the new energy context and a climate crisis impacting many aspects of our lives. I am sure that the ICCP will have a long and productive future in the service of the society and wish the best success to those driving the



Geological Society of America Energy Geology (formerly Coal Geology) Division Started in 1946 as part of Society of Economic Geologists

Migrated to GSA in 1964

Gilbert Cady Award first presented in 1973 (7 of 38 awardees are UK geologists)

American Association of Petroleum Geologists Energy Minerals Division

Gordon H. Wood, Jr., Memorial Award first awarded in 1989

(presented by Eastern Section, usually to eastern US people; 8 of 28 to UK geologists)

#### International Committee for Coal & Organic Petrology (ICCP) founded in 1953

Reinhardt Thiessen Medal first awarded in 1956 (one awardee with UK connections) North American Coal Petrographers

Informal group started in 1950's

24th meeting held in Lexington in 1981

25th & last meeting in 1983 as transition to TSOP

#### The Society for Organic Petrology (TSOP) founded in 1983

Created in part because oil & gas industry people needed formal organization to justify their participation

1st meeting in 1984

Meetings in Lexington in 1986, 1991, 1997; Louisville in 2005

Spawned Ohio Valley Organic Petrographers in 2010





# Obituary Dr Harold Smith (1924)—4 Jan 2023

The ICCP loses its last Founding Member A.H.V. (Harold) Smith

It is with great sadness that the ICCP has lost Harold Smith in early 2023, the only remaining member of the ICCP founders in 1953 in Geleen, The Netherlands. Harold passed away at the age of 99 after a long life in which research in organic petrology and coal geology played a key role. From the Department of Geology at the University of Sheffield where he developed his research career, he made extraordinary contributions to Coal Geology and Palynology and also to the industrial applications of organic petrology that earned him the Thiessen Medal in 1990. Harold's contribution to the ICCP has been enormous. Since the beginning, he was part of the Nomenclature Subcommittee and actively contributed to drafting the Handbook, a fabulous task accomplished in record time as the initial product of the ICCP. A success story characterized by the generous work of the collaborators that made the ICCP known throughout the world. Harold has served on the Council first as Secretary (1980-1985) and then as Chairman (1985-1988) of Commission I. During this term, he hosted the 39th Meeting of the ICCP in Doncaster, UK, where the Program for Accreditation received the final push and Harold was instrumental in this

action. He was also part of the Review Panel, the group of experts selected to deal with appeals received about the accreditation results when the participant disagreed with the outcome. Harold has supported the ICCP in countless ways: He has reviewed the first 10 years of the ICCP in an unforgettable document published in the special volume celebrating the 50<sup>th</sup> Meeting that will allow us to keep memories of the early days alive. He has fed the Archive with his documents, especially relevant for keeping track of the early days when the minutes were not published. His generous contribution to the institution was recognized in 1992 when he was appointed as Honorary Member of the ICCP. Harold regularly attended ICCP Meetings from the first in Geleen to the 50th in Porto in 1998. But this was by no means the end of his contribution to the ICCP as he was a Returning Officer for elections since the incorporation of this role into the statutes in 1999 until 2013.

Harold has been an outstanding organic petrographer, a gentle person, a great asset to the ICCP and an extremely likeable man. We have known through his son that he was very proud of his work with the ICCP. We would like to send our condolences to his family. Those who had the privilege to meet Harold at any of the many ICCP Meetings he attended will never forget him.


